The quorum for Panorama City Neighborhood Council committees is three. Public comments on agenda items will be heard when the item is considered. Public comments on other matters within the committee's jurisdiction may be made during the Public Comment period. Public comments are limited to two minutes per speaker. Action may be taken on any agenda item except Public Comment, announcements and reports. You may request a copy of printed materials that are distributed at the meeting. You may record the meeting by audio, video or photographic means as long as it is not disruptive. Meeting notices and agendas are posted at Plaza del Valle, Community Room (see below). If you need translation, or accommodation for a disability, please call the city Department of Neighborhood Empowerment at least three business days in advance (213-978-1551, or toll-free 3-1-1). The city is a covered entity under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act. If you believe the council is not following the law or its own rules you may file a grievance in writing with copies to both the Chair and the Secretary. - 0:00 4. Consideration and possible action on the reassignment of all members of the LAPD Mission Division Gang Unit. The reassignment follows allegations that officers failed to turn on their body cameras and failed to properly document traffic stops. The action came after a person who claimed that his car was stopped without probable cause in December, 2022,, that he was detained, and that his car was searched without

permission. The investigation and discipline actions may continue for as long as a year. Two officers may already be in the process of being fired.

LAPD Mission Division, which serves Panorama City, Arleta, North Hills East, Mission Hills and Sylmar, has one of the largest gang units in the city (12 or 13 officers). According to the Los Angeles Times, Mission Division is one of the most active in the city i9n making traffic stops. Nearly 10 percent of its traffic stops are 'pretextual' (meaning they are for minor violations, with the intent of looking for more serious problems), which is among the highest rates in the city.

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Council Process: The council gained its official city role upon certification by the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners on March 15, 2007. Everyone who lives, works or owns real property within the boundaries of the Panorama City Neighborhood Council, or who declares a Community Interest in the area and the basis for it, is a "stakeholder". All stakeholders are members of the Council. Stakeholders elect a Board of Directors to represent them. This Board is recognized as the decision-making entity by the City of Los Angeles. The current Board was elected on April 20, 2021. The next election is planned for Spring, 2023. While the Board is the official decision-making entity, meetings are conducted as much as possible in a town hall spirit. Committees are open to anyone with an interest in Panorama City. Panorama City's neighborhood council is much more than its Board, and it depends on public participation for its success.

Posting Sites: California's open meetings law, the Ralph M. Brown Act, requires that meeting notices be physically posted at a regular location 72 hours in advance for regular meetings and 24 hours in advance for special meetings. The location must be accessible to the public seven days a week, 24 hours a day. That location is the outside windows or steel doors of the Plaza Del Valle Community Room, Building G, 8700 Van Nuys Boulevard, Panorama City, CA 91402. This council is also required to follow the City of Los Angeles posting policy for Neighborhood Councils. That policy additionally requires that councils post agendas through the city's Early Notification System (ENS), post the agendas on the council's website (if one exists), and make an effort to send agendas by electronic mail (if such a list exists). This council posts agendas on its website, panoramacitync.org. This council uses the city's ENS mailing list as its agenda email list. La reasignación se produce tras acusaciones de que los agentes no encendieron sus cámaras corporales y no documentaron adecuadamente las detenciones de tráfico. La acción se produjo luego de que una persona afirmó que su auto fue detenido sin causa probable en diciembre de 2022, que fue detenido y que su auto fue registrado sin permiso. Las acciones de investigación y disciplina pueden continuar hasta por un año. Es posible que dos agentes ya estén en proceso de ser despedidos.

La División de Misión del LAPD, que presta servicios en Panorama City, Arleta, North Hills East, Mission Hills y Sylmar, tiene una de las unidades de pandillas más grandes de la ciudad (12 o 13 oficiales). Según Los Angeles Times, Mission Division es una de las más activas de la ciudad en realizar paradas de tráfico. Casi el 10 por ciento de sus paradas de tráfico son "pretextuales" (lo que significa que son por infracciones menores, con la intención de buscar problemas más graves), lo que se encuentra entre las tasas más altas de la ciudad.
