The quorum is 3 Board members or Alternates. Public comments on agenda items will be heard when the item is considered. Public comments on other matters within the council's jurisdiction may be made during the Public Comment period. Public comments are usually limited to two minutes per speaker, at the discretion of the Chair. Action may be taken on any agenda item except Public Comment and announcements. Actions may be reconsidered only if a motion for reconsideration is adopted at the same meeting where the action was taken. You may request a copy of printed materials that are distributed at the meeting. You may record the meeting by audio, video or photographic means as long as it is not disruptive. Meeting notices and agendas are posted at the Plaza Del Valle Community Room and at other locations (see notes below). If you need translation, or accommodation for a disability, please call the city Department of Neighborhood Empowerment at least three business days in advance (213-978-1551, or toll-free 3-1-1). The city is a covered entity under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act. If you believe the council is not following the law or its own rules you may file a grievance in writing with copies to both the Chair and the Secretary. Please be respectful of others, even when you differ with them. Times shown in the agenda are only estimates. The sequence and time may be changed at the meeting.



- 1. Call to Order and Welcome (Pamela Gibberman, Chair) Meeting called to order at 6:07 p.m.
- Roll Call of committee members or alternates (the quorum is three). Present: Pamela, Amelia, Tony Guest: Severiana
- 3. Public Comment and announcements. (Please limit to two minutes per speaker.) Public comment on agenda Items will be heard at the time the item is considered. None
- 4. Follow-up on past items.
 - a. Michael Menjivar said he would research the status of our motion to urge the LAUSD Board of Education to adopt the "Arts ARE Education" Resolution. As of June 2021, 25 schools and districts have passed the resolution and 2,600 individuals have signed the pledge.
 As of this meeting, there was no new information. We would like to know how much of the additional arts
 - funding that Michael told us about last month actually came to Panorama City schools.
 b. Our newest member, Amelia Mendoza, reached out to both Assemblymember Nazarian's and State Senator Hertzberg's office about meeting with our MS/HS students about getting involved with local government. Thank you, Amelia! She received positive responses from both. The question now is how do we proceed? Perhaps start with Angela's leadership class at Panorama HS? By Zoom or in person? One representative at a time or both together?

As a result of our discussion, it was agreed that the Chair would 1) notify the administrators of the Panorama Community of Schools and Monroe Community of Schools about what we are planning, 2) email Angela and Diana at Panorama HS and Lorena at Vista MS about involving the leadership classes at their schools, and 3) contact the principals at the remaining MS and HS in Panorama City to invite the involvement of their students as well. There should also be outreach to Parent Centers at all PC schools, such as Maritza at Noble ES. Tony suggested creating a monthly flyer about opportunities available for students and families to interact with their legislators via Zoom and/or in person.

- c. The first LAUSD Superintendent Search Community Listening Session was last Tuesday, September 21st, at 5:30 p.m. There will be another opportunity for input on Tuesday, September 28th, also at 5:30 p.m. It will be conducted in Spanish with English translation. The flyer with the Zoom link will be attached to this agenda.
- 5. Discussion and possible action on setting up a meeting with students and government representatives. Tony moved, Severiana seconded, to ask the PCNC Board to support a Civic Outreach and Engagement Program to involve our local MS/HS students with our local legislators including up to \$200/month for printing. The motion passed unanimously.
- 6. Discussion and possible action on a questionnaire developed at Panorama HS which could also go to Vista MS, GALS, St. Genevieve HS, Valor Academy Charter, and Valor Academy High. This item was tabled.
- 7. Discussion about items for the next meeting on Monday, October 25, 2021. Continue working on community engagement.
- Public Comment and announcements. (Please limit to two minutes per speaker.)
 Amelia announced that she emailed a flyer about a gardening event sponsored by Valley Oaks Center For
 Enriched Studies for eligible LAUSD families to receive an up to 260-square-foot plot to create an urban garden. It
 will be Saturday, October 2, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. at 9071 Kewen St. in Sun Valley, CA 91352.

Council Process: The council gained its official city role upon certification by the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners on March 15, 2007. Everyone who lives, works or owns real property within the boundaries of the Panorama City Neighborhood Council, or who declares a Community Interest in the area and the basis for it, is a "stakeholder". All stakeholders are members of the Council. Stakeholders elect a Board of Directors to represent them. This Board is recognized as the decision-making entity by the City of Los Angeles. The current Board was elected on April 2, 2016. While the Board is the official decision-making entity, meetings are conducted as much as possible in a town hall spirit. Committees are open to anyone with



an interest in Panorama City. Panorama City's neighborhood council is much more than its Board, and it depends on public participation for its success.

Posting Sites: California's open meetings law, the Ralph M. Brown Act, requires that meeting notices be physically posted at a regular location 72 hours in advance for regular meetings and 24 hours in advance for special meetings. The location must be accessible to the public seven days a week, 24 hours a day. That location is the outside steel doors of the Plaza Del Valle Community Room, Building G, 8700 Van Nuys Blvd, Panorama City, CA 91402. This council is also required to follow the City of Los Angeles posting policy for Neighborhood Councils. That policy additionally requires that councils post agendas through the city's Early Notification System (ENS), post the agendas on the council's website (if one exists), and make an effort to send agendas by electronic mail (if such a list exists). This council posts agendas on its website, panoramacitync.org. This council uses the city's ENS mailing list as its agenda email list. You may sign up for the ENS agenda system at: http://lacity.org/government/Subscriptions/NeighborhoodCouncils/index.htm.

In addition to the Plaza Del Valle posting location, this council MAY post agendas at other locations within Panorama City. These may include: (1) Panorama City Branch Library, 14345 Roscoe Blvd; (2) Panorama Recreation Center, 8600 Hazeltine Avenue; (3) Sepulveda Recreation Center, 8801 Kester Avenue; and (4) Casa Esperanza, 14705 Blythe Street.

In addition to the ENS agenda list, this council MAY include agendas in its occasional informational emails. You can subscribe to the council's informational email list by sending your request to 'info@panoramacitync.org'. You can also sign up on the council's website. In order to respect our stakeholders' inboxes, messages to the informational email list will be sent at most once or twice a month. The only way to assure that you will receive emailed agendas is through the ENS list.

In compliance with Government Code section 54957.5, non-exempt writings that are distributed to a majority or all of the Board or committee *in advance of a meeting* may be viewed by appointment at the Panorama City Neighborhood Council office, 14500 Roscoe Blvd, Suite 400, Panorama City, CA 91401, (818-714-2133) during normal business hours, or at the scheduled meeting. 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Virtual Meeting Guidelines

- Upon entry to the meeting, all participants will be automatically placed on 'mute' as to not disrupt the current speaker.
- The Chair will run the meeting as 'close to normal' as possible, limiting the amount of time individual speakers may hold the floor.
- If you wish to speak, do so by 'Raising your Hand', a feature the platform has, which enables the formation of a queue.
- The Board Secretary will recognize your place in the queue, by responding through the 'Chat' feature.
- The Chair will then call upon, in 'first come first served' order as recognized by the Secretary. Once called upon, the speaker must UNMUTE their audio to begin their statement.
- Disruptions to the meeting or abuse of these guidelines will result in the immediate removal.
- Public Comment will also adhere to the 'Raise Hand', 'Enter the Queue', 'Be Recognized by the Chair' format.
